One of the great privileges of ministry among the poor and disadvantaged is seeing the power of the Gospel and the redeeming work of Jesus transform people's lives. At times it really is miraculous as God's Spirit takes truly broken people and begins to put them back together.

But like all Christian stories of redemption ministry is often three steps forward and two steps backward. Sometimes when we see new Christians with complex difficulties backsliding in the faith we are tempted to step in and try to save them. This desire to help often comes from real love and compassion. But it's easy to then put ourselves in situations where we are not practicing wise boundaries, or we are attempting to deal with complex issues for which we do not have the training or experience.

In difficult pastoral situations, it is important to remember, that Jesus is their Saviour. He loves them even more than you and he will help them work out all their struggles as they trust him. Be wary of becoming a saviour figure yourself! Know your limits. Keep pointing people to Jesus and if you're ever in doubt about a pastoral situation, err on the side of caution and double check with Jesus Cares staff.

Brett and I took the shoes as it was clearly a sign from God. The next week we saw the young man, we told



him the story and gave him the shoes. He felt so overwhelmed with emotion and how there's a God who knows him and his needs. He asked me: 'How did you know that I needed new shoes and what size I was?' - I replied: 'I heard you say in a conversation under your breath that your shoes were broken and it was the only pair you had. However the part of actually getting you these shoes, that's all from God. I didn't do that part.'
